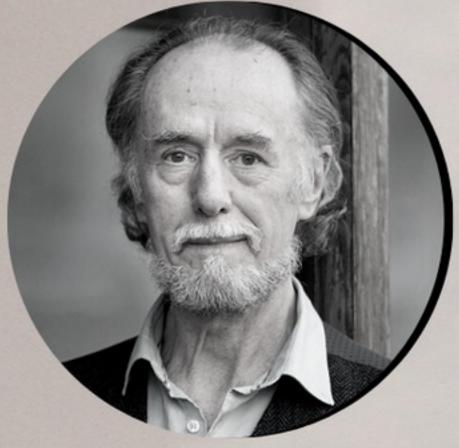

Graham Parkes is a Professorial Research Fellow at the University of Vienna. He has published extensively in the field of environmental philosophy, especially from the cross-cultural perspectives of European and East-Asian philosophy. His latest book is How to Think about the Climate Crisis: A Philosophical Guide to Saner Ways of Living (Bloomsbury 2021).

Description: The two most recent comprehensive reports about the situation with the climate, from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (Aug 2021 and Feb 2022), are nothing less than terrifying. We have already pumped so much greenhouse gas into the climate system that, even if we drastically reduce our emissions almost immediately (a highly improbable scenario), we're likely to produce a temperature increase of 1.6°C over pre-industrial times by the middle of this century. The resulting extremes of weather will render many areas of the planet uninhabitable, with devastating consequences for human lives and livelihoods all over the world. This presentation will consider how can we best respond to this situation—individually, socially, politically, economically, fairly and justly—from the perspectives of Chinese and Japanese as well as Western philosophy.
