Title:

Freedom in the Anthropocene: Bringing political philosophy to global environmental problems

Bio:

Prof. Dr. Mark Coeckelbergh is a full Professor of Philosophy of Media and Technology at the Philosophy of Department of the University of Vienna, and until recently Vice Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy and Education. He is also the former President of the Society for Philosophy and Technology (SPT). His expertise focuses on ethics and technology, in particular robotics and artificial intelligence. He is a member of various entities that support policy building in the area of robotics and artificial intelligence, such as the European Commission's High Level Expert Group on Artificial Intelligence, the Austrian Council on Robotics and Artificial Intelligence, and the Austrian Advisory Council on Automated Mobility. He is the author of 16 philosophy books and numerous articles, and is involved in several national and European research projects on AI and robotics.

Abstract:

In the current planetary ecological situation, often referred to as the Anthropocene, political thinking needs to become more environmental and environmental issues need to be not only tackled from an environmental ethics point of view but also from a political-philosophical perspective. In this talk I present my book *Green Leviathan or the Poetics of Political Liberty* as an example of how to use political philosophy in this context. I focus on the problem of freedom: what does freedom mean in the current global situation and how can we move towards a more relational understanding of the concept in the 21st century?
